



## Mobius Cowl

A free download pattern designed by Brian Kohler for **skacel collection, Inc.**



**SKILL LEVEL:** Intermediate

**YARN WEIGHT:** Chunky

**SIZE:** One size. 4" x 28"

**YARN:** **Accordion** by **Schulana**, 80% Merino Extrafine, 20% Kid Mohair, 93 yds / 50 g.

1 ball (93 yds).

Shown in Color #06

**addi Needle:**

3.75 mm (approx US 10.75) 47" circular needle

**Note:** Gauge is not crucial to this pattern.

**Additional Notions:**

Tapestry needle.

All yarn and needles distributed by **skacel collection, Inc.**

**STITCH PATTERN:**

**Cross Hatch Round:**

The Cross Hatch Round is achieved by working a rnd of dropped stitches, and crossing them in groups of 6. In other words, it is a left-crossing cable (3 over 3). A cable needle is not necessary, but if one is used, the end result will be the same. The technique is described below.

Work rnd as follows: \*Sl6, dropping additional wraps on each stitch. Let the first 3 stitches on the right needle drop off the needle (or move them onto a cable needle and hold in front), slip the next 3 stitches from the right needle to the left needle, allowing the dropped sts to pass in front, then place the dropped stitches (or the sts from the cable needle) back onto the left needle. Knit each of the 6 sts. Repeat from \* to end of rnd.

**INSTRUCTIONS:**

Using Cat Bordhi's Mobius Cast On, CO 96 sts = 192 sts.

Join and place marker to note start of round.

**Rnds 1 & 3:** Knit.

**Rnd 2:** Purl.

**Rnd 4:** \*K1, YO 3x, rep from \* to end of rnd.

**Rnd 5:** Sl1, drop YOs.

**Rnd 6:** Work Cross Hatch Round.

**Rnd 7:** Purl.

**Bind off rnd:**

Cast on 3 sts (cable cast on is recommended).

\*K2, SSK, slip these sts back to left needle; rep from \* until 3 sts remain. Cut yarn leaving an 8" tail and using a tapestry needle, sew or graft to start of round.

Weave in loose ends.

**ABBREVIATIONS:**

**approx** approximate(ly)

**k** knit

**sl** slip (unless otherwise stated, slip as if to purl)

**SSK** Slip 2 stitches knitwise, one at a time, from the left needle to the right needle then insert the left needle into the front of the slipped stitches and knit them together

**st(s)** stitch(es)

**x** times

**YO** Yarn Over
